

Protect Your Child from Pneumococcal Disease



WHAT IS IT?

Pneumococcal disease is a bacterial disease that can cause three serious infections:

- meningitis (brain infection)
- bacteremia (bloodstream infection)
- pneumonia (lung infection)



WHO IS AT RISK?

Children:

- under the age of 2
- with an immunocompromising condition or chronic illness such as:
 - sickle cell disease
 - pulmonary disease
 - kidney disease
 - HIV
 - diabetes
 - heart disease
- who are on immunosuppressive therapy
- with cochlear implants
- 2 to 17 years of age with asthma

It is part of routine childhood immunizations.
